RMAC Names All-Time Wrestling Team

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. -- **January 28, 2009** -- The top 12 wrestlers and head coach in RMAC wrestling history have been selected to help celebrate the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference's 100th anniversary in 2009. The RMAC is the fourth oldest conference in the country, and the most historic in the western U.S.

The RMAC All-Time Men's Wrestling Team was selected by representatives from the conference's schools that participate in the sport of wrestling. Official records for RMAC wrestling date back to 1972, but it is known that the conference has sponsored the sport of wrestling since at least the 1950s.

RMAC Hall of Famer Chuck Pipher leads the team. Pipher was a 3-time national champion at Southern Colorado (now CSU-Pueblo). Pipher is now the head wrestling coach at Mesa State.

"It is quite an honor that the representatives from the schools would pick me," said Pipher. "It is kind of shocking I guess. Epecially when you consider the guys out over the last 50 some years, it is an honor."

The RMAC All-Time Top Coach is Tracy Borah, who led Western State to the 1963 and 1964 NCAA Division II National Championships (at that time it was called the collegiate division).

Eight schools are represented on the 12-man all-time team. RMAC schools have won 12 national team championships.

As part of the Centennial Celebration, all-time teams are being selected in 19 RMAC sports. The RMAC's Centennial Celebration will take place on July 11, 2009 at the Cheyenne Mountain Resort in Colorado Springs. More information to come in the next few months. A new all-time team will be recognized each month leading up to the celebration.
